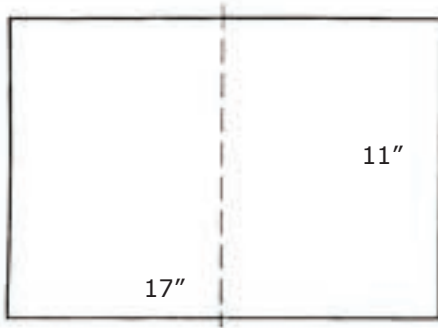
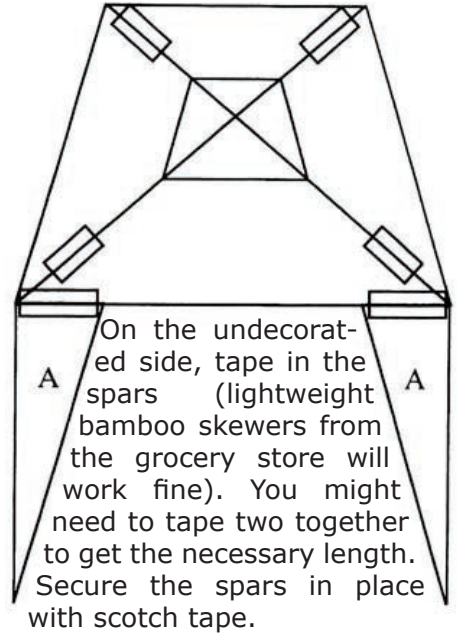

Fold a piece of 11 x 17 inch bond paper (the type used in computers and copiers) in half.



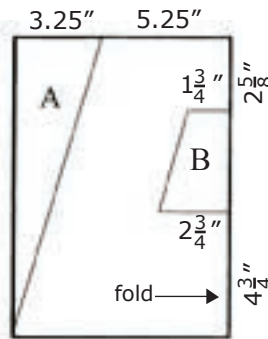

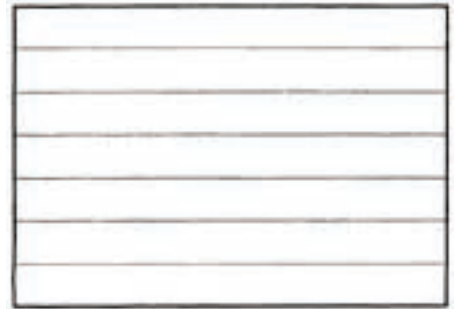
On the undecorated side, tape in the spars (lightweight bamboo skewers from the grocery store will work fine). You might need to tape two together to get the necessary length. Secure the spars in place with scotch tape.

Make cuts as indicated. Part A will give you two pieces; these are the tail pieces. B will be cut out and thrown away, leaving a trapezoidal opening. Open the paper and decorate.

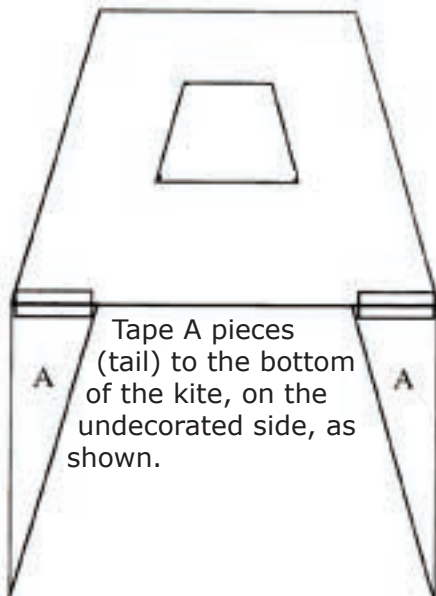

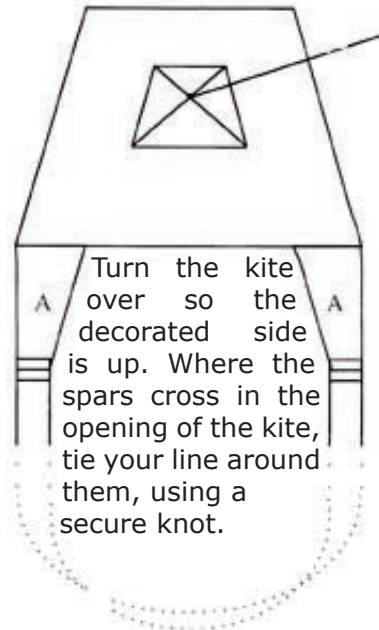
Cut lengthwise strips, as shown, from a second piece of 11 x 17 bond paper. Join the pieces together to make a long tail. Attach this tail to the ends of the A pieces (in step 3) with tape to make a long loop.

Tape A pieces (tail) to the bottom of the kite, on the undecorated side, as shown.

Turn the kite over so the decorated side is up. Where the spars cross in the opening of the kite, tie your line around them, using a secure knot.
